



WHAT IS THE MEDICAL ASSISTANT TRAINING PROGRAM AT BAPTIST HEALTH?

Our Medical Assistant Training Program prepares individuals who have little to no medical experience to perform safe, patient-centered care as medical assistants in an outpatient setting. During the eight-week, paid training program, preceptors guide students in a combination of classroom instruction and externship hours. Upon successful completion, our goal is to find students placement positions within our family of Baptist Health Medical Group practices.

What supplies will I need?

- Medical assisting training manual, which will be given to you by your instructor on the first day of class.
- Stethoscope and watch with second hand.
- Internet access.
- Zoom access.

What is the dress code?

- Wear solid color scrubs per Regions guidelines.

Do I have to take an exam to complete the program?

Grades will be based on a variety of methods. You will be expected to pass:

- Quizzes and exams, including final.
- Skills lab training.
- Validations with preceptor.
- Basic Life Support.
- Final skills assessment with educators.

This program is pass/fail and students need a cumulative average of at least 80% to pass.

What skills does this course provide after completion?

- Administer injections.
- Perform point of care laboratory testing.
- Perform accurate vital sign measurements.
- Perform accurate EKG placements.

How does post-program job placement work?

After completion of the course, students can apply for medical assistant position openings, including the float pool.

Will I be a certified medical assistant after program completion?

No, after two years of clinical experience, you will be eligible to sit for the NCCT certification exam.
